



Dear Families,

The Millville Area School District is pleased to announce that students will be returning to their community schools next week as planned. Specifically, students who attend the Millville Elementary School (Grades: K-6) will return to school on Tuesday, January 19th for Face-to-Face instruction. While students who attend the Millville Junior/Senior High School (Grades: 7-12) will return to school on Wednesday, January 20th for Face-to-Face instruction. On Monday, January 18, 2021, the district will be closed in observation of Martin Luther King Jr. Day.

Consistent with the district's Phased School Reopening Health and Safety Plan, upon the students' return, the Millville Area School District will continue to maintain and enforce the highest standards of safety possible in order to ensure the health and welfare of district faculty, staff, students, and community members. Specifically, the district will require all individuals to wear appropriate face coverings, maintain social distancing to the maximum extent possible, and adhere to operational practices that minimize the transmission of COVID-19.

In order to ensure that your student has most successful transition back to their community school, parents and guardians should complete the School Enrollment Form which can be accessed in the Sapphire Portal. Parents and guardians must complete a School Enrollment Form for each child that attends within the district to ensure that their school is prepared to provide them with their preferred model of instruction: 1.) Traditional (F2F); 2.) Hybrid (Alternating days of F2F); 3.) Synchronous (Real-Time Online with MASD teachers and classmates); or Asynchronous (MVA Cyber-School). The School Enrollment Form has been reopened for parent and guardian input and will close by Thursday at 1PM.

The district will continue to monitor the progress of COVID-19 and communicate the status of transmission and positivity within our schools to our community. Furthermore, the district will continue to monitor positive cases within our schools and collaborate with the PaDOH to ensure that the district's response is guided by the state health agencies and all efforts to maintain the safety and welfare of students, faculty, and staff are undertaken.

I would like to extend a heartfelt "THANK YOU!" to our faculty, staff, and families for working together in partnership through this period of remote full-online instruction. On behalf of the district, we are very excited for the students' return next week!
